

hey say a dog is man's best friend. But those adorable leashes you've seen in dog boutiques are expensive. Why not make your pal a cool custom dog leash? This 6-foot-long, ribbon dog leash is an easy and affordable way to guarantee your pup will be stylin'.

Creating a ribbon dog leash for your pooch takes about an hour and is a great project for a beginning sewer. Use nylon webbing for support, ribbon for glamour, and a swivel hook for function. I chose grosgrain ribbon for a preppy look, but you can use any ribbon or trim you like.

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## Supplies & sources

- · Matches or lighter
- Nylon webbing, 70 inches (Strapworks.com)
- Pins
- Ribbon or trim, 70 inches (TheRibbonRetreat.com, JKMRibbon.com, MJTrim.com)
- Ruler
- · Sewing machine
- Swivel hook (Strapworks.com)
- Thread
- Optional:

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## Walk your dog in style

Make a dog leash your pup will be proud of in four simple steps.



## WEBBING.

To prevent the ends from fraying, fuse the cut ends of your webbing. Pass them through a match flame several times. Or, if you'd prefer, attach webbing tips.



2 STITCH THE EDGES.

Sew the grosgrain ribbon to the nylon webbing along both long edges.



3 MAKE THE HANDLE. Measure down 71/2 inches on one end of the leash, fold it over, and pin it to the leash. Sew a small square, and then sew an "X" through it, as shown above, to secure the handle



 $4 \} {\scriptsize \textbf{ADD A SWIVEL HOOK.}} \ \, \text{On the opposite end of the strap,} \\ \text{thread the nylon webbing through the swivel hook.} \\ \text{Fold the} \\$ webbing over 1 inch, and pin it in place. Repeat the box stitch shown in step 3 to secure the leash hook. Then, you're ready to lead the way.
